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# From the 2023 Host Committee

#### Family Medicine: Anchoring Patients and Communities!

On behalf of the 17 family medicine residency training programs from 6 states represented on the Host Committee, we are excited to welcome you to Providence, RI and the greater New England area.

This year's theme was chosen to recognize family medicine as a stabilizing force, or "anchor," in healthcare in the United States. The theme also metaphorically honors our conference hosts in the Ocean State. All hands on deck as we set sail for a great Annual Meeting in Providence!

By staying secure in the ocean floor, an anchor serves to steady a boat in both calm and choppy waters. The anchor stabilizes the boat during heavy winds, incoming waves and tides. Anchors can be temporary or fixed but can be moved in the midst of changing conditions.

Family physicians serve as anchors in their medical schools, mentoring and guiding students as they wade through their clinical training. Family physicians also care about learners' and colleagues' well-being and help residents, faculty and students develop skills to drop anchors during stressful times and promote long-term personal wellness. Family physicians shore up patients during vulnerable times, providing care to parents and newborns as a dyad, assisting in transitions of care from hospital to home and sitting bedside at the end of life. Family physicians care for humans in utero and throughout the entire lifespan, charting a course for compassionate care through both the smooth sailing and the turbulent storms of life. As social and racial disparities abound, family medicine remains anchored in the biopsychosocial model of care that promotes high quality, equitable care.

Through the telescopes that we use in family medicine, we focus on individuals and their health conditions. We change lenses to see our patients as they need us to, interpreting health care needs in the context of their resources and communities in which they live. From our anchored position as the foundation in medicine, family physicians are uniquely suited to help families and communities chart a course for optimal health despite the changing seas of healthcare.

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# **Description of Presentation Formats**

#### Workshops (1 hour)

Workshops are designed to transmit specific skills and are directed toward learning methodologies and strategies for approaching problems in teaching students, residents and faculty. The participants should be actively involved and should be able to acquire an understanding of various approaches to these problems. Some workshops may be scheduled for 90 minutes.

#### Seminars (1 hour)

Seminars are designed to transmit specific knowledge in a given area and consist of a combination of formal presentations and group discussions.

#### Research and Quality Improvement

(30 minutes each - or 2 per 1-hour block) These presentations report rigorously-designed investigations or quality improvement activities and are followed by a moderated discussion.

#### Paper Presentations

#### (15 minutes each - or 4 per 1-hour block)

Paper presentations provide an opportunity to present to a wide audience about research, scholarship, curricular design, teaching programs, community service, and any other topic of interest related to family medicine. Both completed projects and those under development may be presented. They are typically grouped into an hour– long session featuring four presentations.

#### Lecture Discussions

#### (20 minutes each - or 3 per 1-hour block)

The Lecture Discussion format involves a 20-minute presentation to share information that relates to a clinical, educational or policy topic, report of a project and/or activity, or introduction of a policy issue, along with time for participant discussion. They are typically grouped into an hour-long session featuring three presentations.

#### Posters (60 minutes per session)

Scientific posters are presented on various topics of interest in family medicine, with authors available for discussion.

#### Clinical Success Stories, Power Stories and Speed Presentations (5-7 minutes each)

This format provides the presenter 5-7 minutes and a maximum of 5 slides to share ideas and information in a focused, direct manner, followed by discussion. They are typically grouped with 4–6 in an hour–long session.

Clinical Camp Tables (45 minutes per session) This format is an opportunity to watch and participate in a hands–on demonstration of a clinical procedure commonly performed in family medicine, using patient models and materials.

#### Breakfast Table Discussions (45 minutes)

Breakfast Table Discussions are opportunities during the Saturday breakfast for scholarly and networking discussions. The title of the table is the topic, and presenters may provide brief opening remarks but generally facilitate discussion of the topic.

#### Tracks

The FMEC designates some programs as part of thematic tracks to help you plan your participation. In addition to usual tracks such as Maternal and Child Health, and Osteopathic Medicine, the FMEC has made some new additions for 2023, to address meeting ACGME requirements, wellness, diversity/equity, and social determinants of health.

# 2023 Annual Meeting Plenary Speakers

#### Friday, October 13, 2023 Evening Plenary Dinner, 5:30 pm – 7:00 pm Transgender Healthcare – Izzy Lowell, MD

Transgender and gender nonbinary people often face social and economic marginalization, and experience a variety of barriers to healthcare, including overt discrimination, inadequate health insurance coverage, legislative interference in the physician-patient relationship, and poor physician knowledge of appropriate treatment. Family physicians are uniquely suited to provide gender-affirming care because of their whole-person focus, ability to create care plans that meet the needs

of diverse individuals, and longitudinal relationship with the patient across the entire lifespan. Family physicians who do not provide this care should take steps to ensure that patients requiring gender-affirming services are appropriately referred.

Dr. Izzy Lowell (she/her) grew up in Massachusetts, where she attended Williams College, followed by the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. She moved to Atlanta in 2013 and joined the faculty at Emory University, where she started the Gender Clinic at Emory. Dr. Lowell is driven by a sense of fairness and equality, and she realized that there are very limited options for trans people to get medical care in the Southeast, so she founded Queermed, a telemedicine practice serving transgender and nonbinary people in 25 states.

#### We Got This Family Medicine - Renee Crichlow, MD

Dr. Crichlow's presentation will portray Family Medicine's versatile and flexible response to the recent pandemic and social upheaval. And how that response is a marker of the value and need for Family Medicine as a specialty. It also wraps advocacy and policy into an understandable, heartfelt

narrative of courage, caring, compassion, and strength. There are even a couple of mentions of a zombie apocalypse and Star Trek, both hypothetical but illustrative!

Renee Crichlow, MD, FAAFP (she/her) has practiced full-spectrum Family Medicine with Obstetrics for more than 20 years and is now the Chief Medical Officer of Codman Square Health Center in Boston, the Vice-chair of Health Equity at the Boston University Department of Family Medicine, and serves as the medical editor for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion at the journal, American Family Physician. Prior to this, Dr Crichlow was at the University of Minnesota as the director of advocacy and policy in the Department of Family Medicine and Community Health and the inaugural holder of the Mac Baird Endowed Chair for Family Medicine Advocacy and Policy. Dr. Crichlow's Fellowships include a Fellowship in Health Policy through the Dept of Health and Human Services, she is a Commissioner for Federal and State Policy for the American Academy of Family Physician, and is the President of the Society of Teachers of Family Medicine and the founder of The Ladder, a mentorship program for kids interested in health careers.

Catalyst for Change: Increasing Access to Safe Abortion Care and Upholding Bodily Autonomy

#### – Manisha Kumar, MD

Dr. Kumar will share her experience from nearly a decade of working with Doctors Without Borders stimulating an institutional culture change to destigmatize abortion and increasing access to safe abortion care in humanitarian settings around the world.

Manisha Kumar, MD (she/her) is a family medicine doctor with a Masters in Public Health and fellowship

training in Obstetrics. She started working for Doctors Without Borders in 2014 and has worked in multiple countries including the Democratic Republic of Congo, Bangladesh, Central African Republic, and Sierra Leone. For 6 years she was head of the Safe Abortion Care Task Force, an initiative aimed at increasing access to safe abortion care in humanitarian settings. She currently resides in the United States.



# **Hereditary Cancer Resources!**

### A conversation can help break the cycle of cancer that runs in families

"When we talk about early onset breast cancer, we're really looking at women between the ages of 18 and 45. Many of them are only getting their care from you. If you're not having this conversation with them, nobody is." Dr. Susanna Evans speaking to the FMEC's cohort of faculty and residents. Early detection, in conjunction with risk reduction, is essential to reducing cancer mortality rates. With an estimated ten percent of cancer diagnoses linked to a high-risk genetic mutation ( $\cong$  200,000/year in the US), identifying and counseling those individuals who carry the mutation can save lives.

However, millions of Americans are unaware that they have a
genetic mutation that increases their risk of developing cancer.

Family physicians are at the heart of early detection and prevention of cancer. You and your care team are uniquely positioned to assess patients' family history, introduce the topic of genetic testing to those who are at risk, and help guide them toward the right resources.

Use the Hereditary Cancer Resource Folder developed through the FMEC's recent learning collaborative to educate and empower your community, so information is at your fingertips when you need it.

The FMEC and our participating residencies have compiled a list of resources for patients and healthcare providers as a starting point. Use the prompts to source and compile folder assets and to determine your clinic's policies and procedures, including the referral process, to use while navigating patients through their hereditary cancer journey.

FMEC, in partnership with the National Association of Chronic Disease Directors and with funding from the CDC, created the collaborative to explore the CDC's Bring Your Brave Campaign. 


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
